Additionally, you will employ creative strategies to expand and diversify Eurocities' funding streams.

You will be part of the project development team and report to the Head of project development.

- Developing and implementing strategies to secure funding, grants, and sponsorships from various philanthropic sources to support Eurocities' initiatives

- Negotiating Eurocities' role and budget for project proposals
